The Over-the-Air Reception Devices (OTARD) Rule was created to promote a fair and competitive market in which any communications business may compete.

Established in 1996, the rule (47 C.F.R Section 1.4000) was implemented to prohibit governmental and private restrictions that impair the ability of antenna users to install, maintain, or use over-the-air reception devices.
