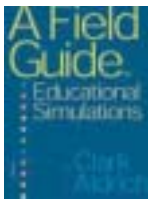
Dr. Richard Lederer

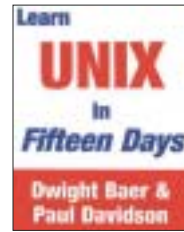

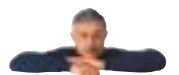

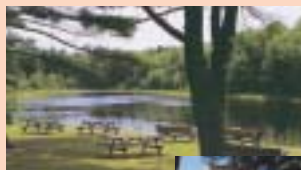

We examine what can be done with both of these technologies individually, and will then look at a powerful example of what can be done using both technologies within the same document.

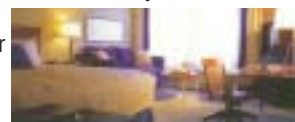

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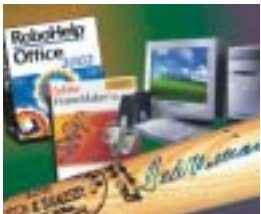
